

Child Advocacy

Child advocacy. Child advocacy refers to a range of individuals, professionals and advocacy organizations who speak out on the best interests of children. An individual or organization engaging in advocacy typically seeks to protect children's rights which may be abridged or abused in a number of areas. - Wikipedia

Since children can't vote we need to advocate for them whether it is a the local, state or national level. Examples of ways to advocate:

Locally: Encourage your Board of Supervisors to support your local library and its children's programs at a higher level this year.

State: Attend a legislative forum and ask a question regarding child care or some other early childhood issue.

National: Free and Reduce Lunch funding is under attack at the federal level. Write your Senator or Representative and tell them how important that is to 35-50% of the families in our local school districts.

Don't be Cooped up Get Outside

The state initiative 5-2-1-0 recommends daily: 5-fruits and vegetables, 2 hours or less of screen time, 1 hour of physical activity and 0 sugary drinks. It says nothing about taking the winter off in regards to physical activity. So let's talk winter weather and safety.
