

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Early Childhood Iowa Designation Process

lowa Code 256I.4(8): 8. Develop and implement a designation process for area boards. Allow for flexibility and creativity of area boards in implementing area board responsibilities and provide authority for the area boards to support the communities in the areas served. The system shall provide for action to address poor performing areas as well as higher performing areas. The state board shall determine how often area boards are reviewed under the system.

Current guidance is for ECI area boards to go through a process every four years to be designated an area. P4F is going through that process of designation this year. As of August 21st our updated Early Childhood Community Plan has been submitted to the state for review. We will hear this winter when the ECI State TA Members will conduct an onsite review of our area. At that time early childhood community professionals will be asked to participate and share their experiences with in our Early Childhood lowa Area. The TA Team Members will also conduct a meeting with the P4F Board.

We look forward to sharing with the state how wonderful our early childhood system is and the great work that all of you do in serving the children of our area.

The Census Bureau announced they intend to move up the reporting deadline for the 2020 Census to September 30, a change that would jeopardize critical outreach efforts needed to ensure the accurate count of marginalized populations, including babies, toddlers, and young children. NAEYC has joined national organizations in calling on Congress to include language in the next COVID relief packet that would extend the statutory reporting deadlines for the 2020 Census by four months, but we simultaneously need your help to continue encouraging families to complete the Census now. Here are some resources to help:
